From the Desk of Gwen Neu:

Stepping Out of the Classroom Adds to the Value of Education

We began the year here at Maple Creek School developing a tight-knit community in which all members are valued and appreciated and assisted as needed. We have woven the idea of community through our study of Ancient Egypt, production of performances, and making of a delicious community soup that we shared with our families and even a local sheriff's deputy.

When we put our books and computers aside and head into town or even to the nearby stream, we see community in action on a grander scale. I love taking our students on field trips because of the opportunities for learning these trips provide. The kids meet various community members, learn about the roles they play in the businesses they serve; they learn about skills and knowledge they will need as they grow and become part of the larger community; and they practice using their self-control as they sometimes have to wait patiently and share in the conversation in a polite manner. Sometimes they even have to learn to deal with less than perfect moments and to be flexible when events don't quite work out as planned.

Community Studies Continue With Tours of Los Bagels and the Eureka Co-op By Jaylenne Harris

Maple Creek School students went to the Eureka Co-op and Los Bagels to learn about their community. They went to Los Bagels on November 21, 2014 and North Coast COOP on December 3, 2014.

The students started to learn about communities on the first day of school. They learned about the roles people play in communities. They also learned about how businesses help and why there are rules. As part of these studies, they went to two businesses in person.

First, the kids went to Los Bagels in Arcata, California. The owner is Jewish and Mexican, so he wanted to have both of his cultures in his shop. He offers bagels, which are a Jewish food and "dead bread," which honors the Mexican tradition of Day of the Dead. The tour guide showed us the equipment used to make the bagels. There was a mixer that mixes the bagel dough. There was a worker, and he hand-made the bagels. The kids watched him shaped slugs. When the tour was over, they got free bagels and cream cheese, and it was nice of the business to give them to its visitors.

A few days later, the students visited the North Coast Co-op's Eureka store. The tour guide told the kids that they have 26 farms to supply the produce the store sells. She showed them some cool equipment, such as the peanut grinder. She put fresh peanuts in the grinder and ran the



machine. She gave the students the ground peanuts, which was peanut butter. The she showed them a lot of refrigerators and freezers. The students got to go inside them. They were cold! The co-op has a kitchen, and the students might take a cooking class there.

The Nutcracker Ballet is based on the story "The Nutcracker and the King of Mice" written by E.T.A. Hoffman. It's the story of a young German girl who dreams of a Nutcracker Prince and a fierce battle against a Mouse King with seven heads.

It is Christmas Eve at the Stahlbaum house. The Stahlbaums are hosting their annual Christmas party, welcoming the arrival of their family and friends. The children, Clara and Fritz, are dancing and playing as they welcome their friends, too, when Clara's godfather, Herr Drosselmeyer, arrives. He is a skilled clock and toy maker and always full of surprises. He gives Clara a beautiful Nutcracker that becomes the hit of the party. Fritz becomes jealous and promptly breaks it. Drosselmeyer quickly repairs the Nutcracker with a handkerchief he magically draws from the air. Clara leaves the Nutcracker under the Christmas tree

Just before the clock rings in Christmas Day, Clara, worried about her beloved Nutcracker, sneaks back to the tree to check on him and falls asleep with him in her arms. As the clock strikes midnight, strange things begin to happen. The room fills with an army of mice, led by the fierce Mouse King. As the Nutcracker awakens, he leads his army of toy soldiers into battle with the mice. The Mouse King corners the Nutcracker and battles him one-on-one. The Nutcracker seems to be no match for the Mouse King. Clara makes a final daring charge throwing her slipper at the Mouse King, hitting him square on the head. The Prince tells her about their daring battle with the army of mice and she rewards them with a celebration of six dances. As a finale, the Sugar Plum Fairy and the Cavalier dance together.

tablets didn't get the Wi-Fi.


In the end, the 6th graders got to check out books.






They loved seeing the fish.

Humboldt Arts Council Provides Activities for Families





Maple Creek School is a necessary small school with an approximate enrollment of 12 students (K-8). The school is nestled in the Maple Creek and Mad River Valleys east of Arcata, surrounded by pastureland, forest, and mountains. The area is sparsely settled and accessible from Blue Lake, about a 35-minute drive and from Eureka, about a 50-minute drive. The Maple Creek School teachers are a committed and dedicated staff that provides a quality instructional program for the students. The secretary, custodian and bus driver all take an active interest in the students, which adds to the close, personal relationships among the kids, school and the community.
